- 745 Boil Water notices statewide, which is serving a population of 1 million
- Only 30 drinking water systems are showing as un-operational
- Donations needed: Water, canned protein, shelf stable meals, money; basic needed plumbing supplied list has been shared
- Courtney reported that she anticipates holding long term recovery calls as soon as next week.
- iSTAT let's TDEM know and this is how survivors are self-reporting their data and keep promoting that, there are 24,667 total reports and 94% are residences (2,049 reported their home is destroyed or they can no longer live in their home
- 14,000+ no water and 18,000+ damaged pipes as well as over 2,000 cracked/damaged foundations
 - o 844-844-3089, 8a 8p, 7 days a week for those that cannot submit the iSTAT online
 - iSTAT Assessment located at <u>damage.tdem.texas.gov</u> (This helps to get your county declared for FEMA IA)
- We received an additional 18 counties to be declared (as of February 22), which are pending, as a total of 126 counties (people need to report their damage on the iSTAT)
 - Kharley Smith: The 18 counties include Atascosa, Bandera, Brooks, Duval, Eastland, Ector, Goliad,
 Howard, Jim Hogg, Karnes, Kleberg, Leon, Llano, Newton, Robertson, Trinity, Webb, and Willacy
- You can go to FEMA website and search the DR-4586 for Texas and you can download most current map, and you can check daily. *We will also supply this information on our TX VOAD site as well (txvoad.rog)
- If your organization has blankets (*or needs blankets) please send an **email to Damian Morales** to compile a list for blankets or if you have blankets to distribute
- Category B has been approved, but Category A has not
 - o This is all dependent on the pSTAT (Public State of Texas Assistance Tool)
 - This is on a county by county basis
 - Currently only Category B has been approved, which is emergency protective measures
 - o Category A includes debris removal, which is not approved at this time
 - Crisis Cleanup had questions around debris removal and pick up and if volunteers organizations do that
 - o It's not typical that organizations would remove the debris, but there was one entity that did remove debris and that's not normal

• For this February winter weather Public Assistance declaration was granted for Category B – Emergency Protective Measures Emergency Protective Measures are actions taken by a community before, during, and following a disaster to save lives, protect public health and safety, or eliminate immediate threat of significant damage to improved public and private property through cost effective measures.
